WHEREAS, modern building codes include safeguards to protect the public from natural disasters such as snowstorms, tornadoes, fires and earthquakes; and

WHEREAS, Building Safety Month is an opportunity to remind the public about the critical role of our communities' local code officials— largely unknown guardians of public safety—who assure us of safe, efficient and livable buildings; and

WHEREAS, this year's theme "Building Safety Month: Code Officials Keep You Safe" encourages all Americans to become more aware of the importance of building safety and to take appropriate steps to ensure that the places where we live, learn, work, worship and play are safe; and

WHEREAS, each year, in observance of Building Safety Month, Americans are asked to consider projects to improve building safety and sustainability at home and in the community, and to acknowledge the essential service provided to all of us by local and state building departments and federal agencies in protecting lives and property;
