Description: The sections of Chapter 3, Building Planning, provide the necessary criteria for the design and construction of homes. 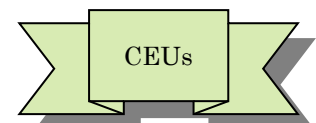

Cooking Fire Facts

Cooking fires are usually caused by grease or food that catches fire, faulty cooking equipment or combustible items placed too close to the stove. This is a result of unattended cooking.

Unattended cooking is the leading factor in home cooking fires. Two-thirds of home cooking fires started when food or other cooking materials caught fire. Clothing was the item first ignited in less than one percent of these fires, but these incidents accounted for 18 percent of the cooking fire deaths.

Home fires are most likely to start in the kitchen from a cooking accident, according to a National Fire Protection Association study, but cooking fires are the cause of only **15** percent of home fire deaths.

Many grease fires occur because someone leaves a frying pan on the stove unattended. They also occur when someone overheats a pan during attended cooking if the grease catches fire. Grease fires can cause serious injury and extensive property damage. Other types of kitchen fires include oven fires and appliance fires.

How to Prevent Electrical Fires

When plugging in or unplugging items:

1. Hold a plug securely to pull it from the wall. ...
2. Use multi-outlet extenders, power bars, and surge protectors sparingly. ...
3. Use extension cords temporarily. ...
4. Avoid running electrical cords beneath carpets.
5. Keep electrical cords away from sources of heat and water.

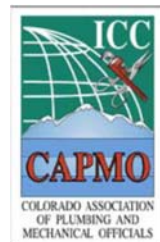
