International Green Construction Code (IgCC)

In early 2012, a new code will be joining the existing I-code family. The International Green Construction Code (IgCC) was developed to provide regulations for green

construction including energy conservation, water efficiency, building owner responsibilities, site impacts, building waste, and materials. The IgCC provides minimal requirements for green building and complements voluntary rating systems such as LEED that go above and beyond the minimum requirements mandated by the code. The new code was developed by experts in government, business and academia, code development and enforcement, architecture, materials science, engineering, and environmental advocacy and then went through public hearings. The final action hearing will be held during the ICC annual convention in Phoenix November 2-6. The model code language will then become law as it is adopted by local authorities. Open-flame cooking devices

2009 IFC-308.1.4

Charcoal burners and other open-flame cooking devices shall not be operated on combustible balconies or within 10 feet (3048 mm) of combustible construction.

Exceptions:

- 1. One- and two-family dwellings.
- 2. Where buildings, balconies and decks are protected by an automatic sprinkler system .
- LP-gas cooking devices having LP-gas container with a water capacity not greater than 2 1/2 pounds [nominal 1 pound (0.454 kg) LP-gas capacity].

Preventing Noise-Induced Hearing Loss

When you know you will be exposed to loud noises, either temporarily or over a long period, using ear plugs or ear muffs can help prevent hearing loss. Ear plugs, which fit into the outer ear canal, and ear muffs, which fit over the entire outside of the ear, decrease the intensity of the sound that reaches the eardrum. Properly fitted ear plugs and ear muffs can reduce noise by 15 to 30 decibels.
